This system has a maximum capacity of 200 lbs. Overloading the system could result in damage to property or injury.

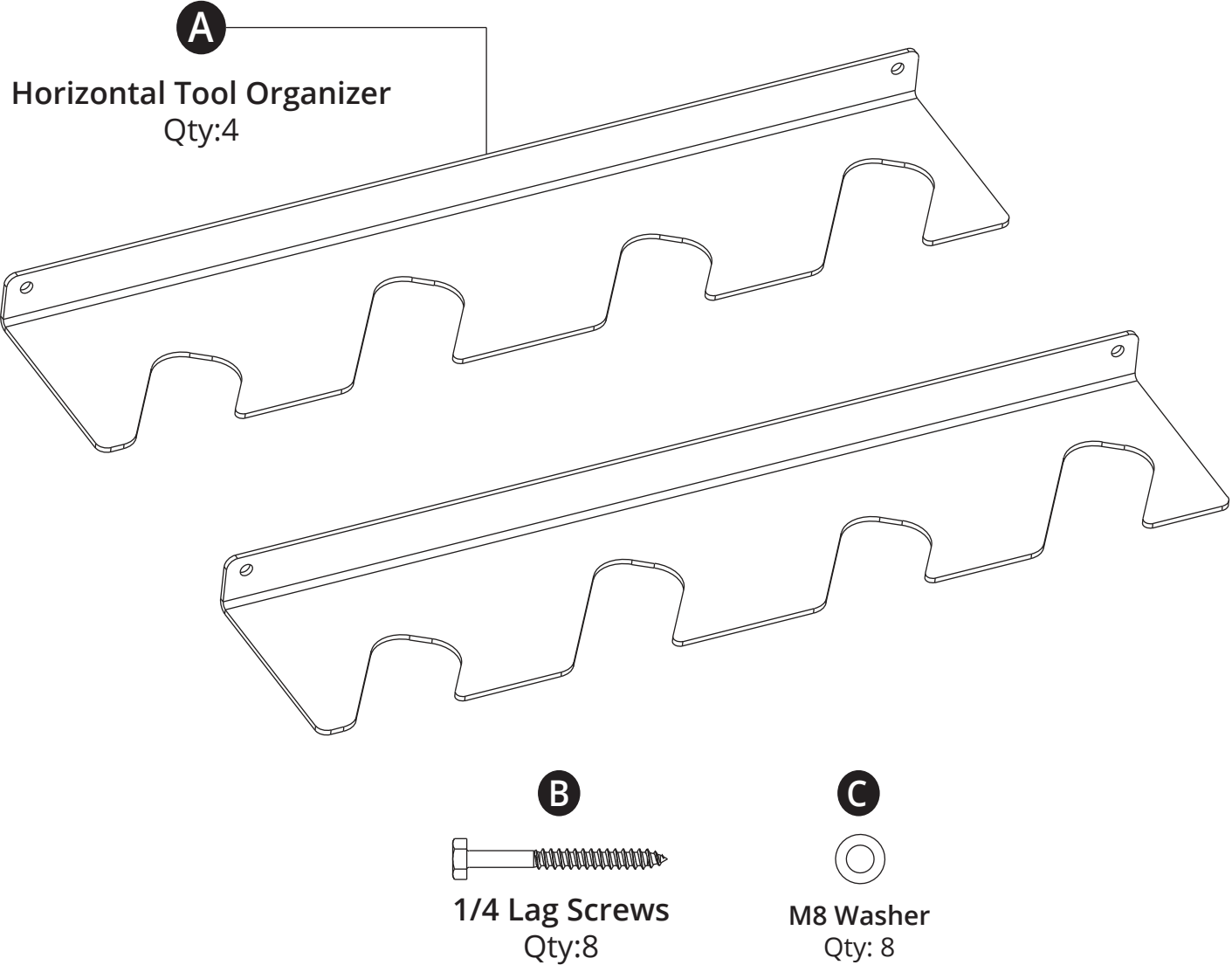
Use extreme caution when loading and unloading equipment from this system.

WEIGHT LIMITS:

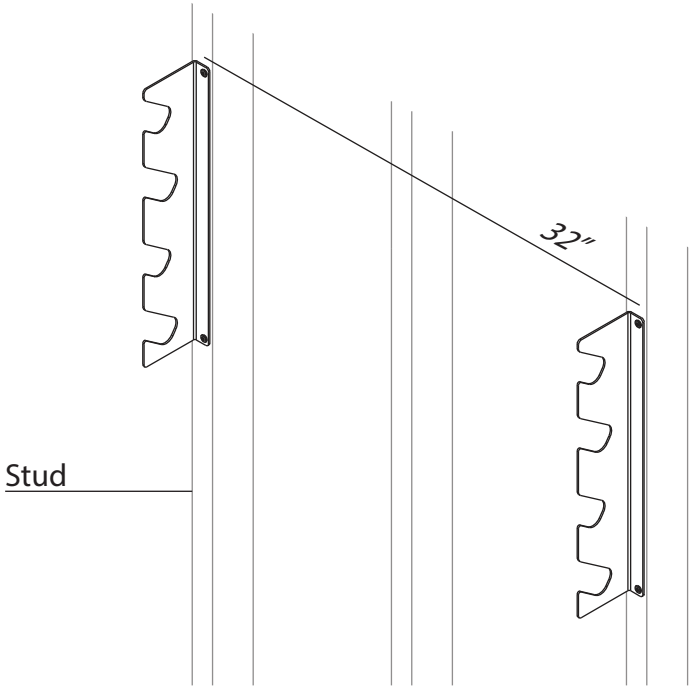
200 lbs. max with stud placement.

NOTE: Horizontal Tool Organizer must be mounted to a wall stud to achieve the maximum advertised weight limit

Locate Wall Studs

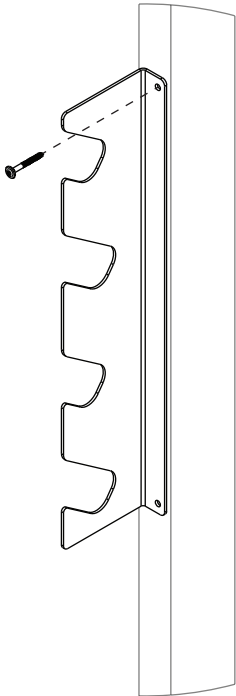
Begin by using a stud finder to identify two suitable wall studs for mounting. While a spacing of 32" generally works well for long-handled tools like shovels, rakes, and brooms, measure your tools to determine the optimal arrangement.



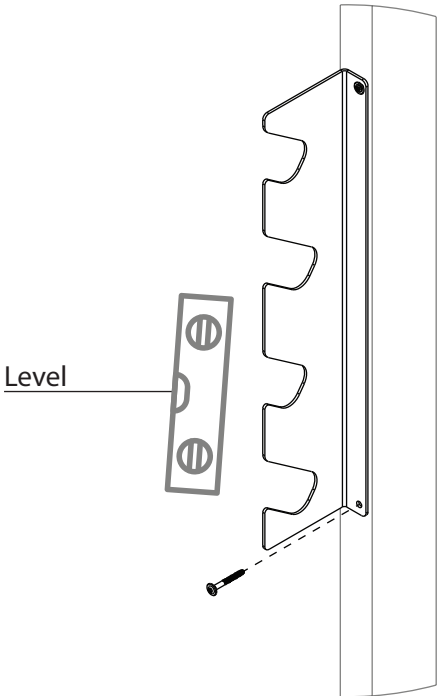

Mount Horizontal Tool Organizer

2a. Hold the Horizontal Tool Organizer (A) against the wall, aligning the mounting hole with the stud location. Pre-drill using a 3/16" drill bit and secure the top hole with an 1/4" Lag screw (B) and Washer (C) using either a 12mm socket wrench or drill.



2b. Use a level to ensure the rack is perpendicular to the floor, then pre-drill and secure the bottom hole with another 1/4" Lag screw and washer. This ensures a stable and level installation.

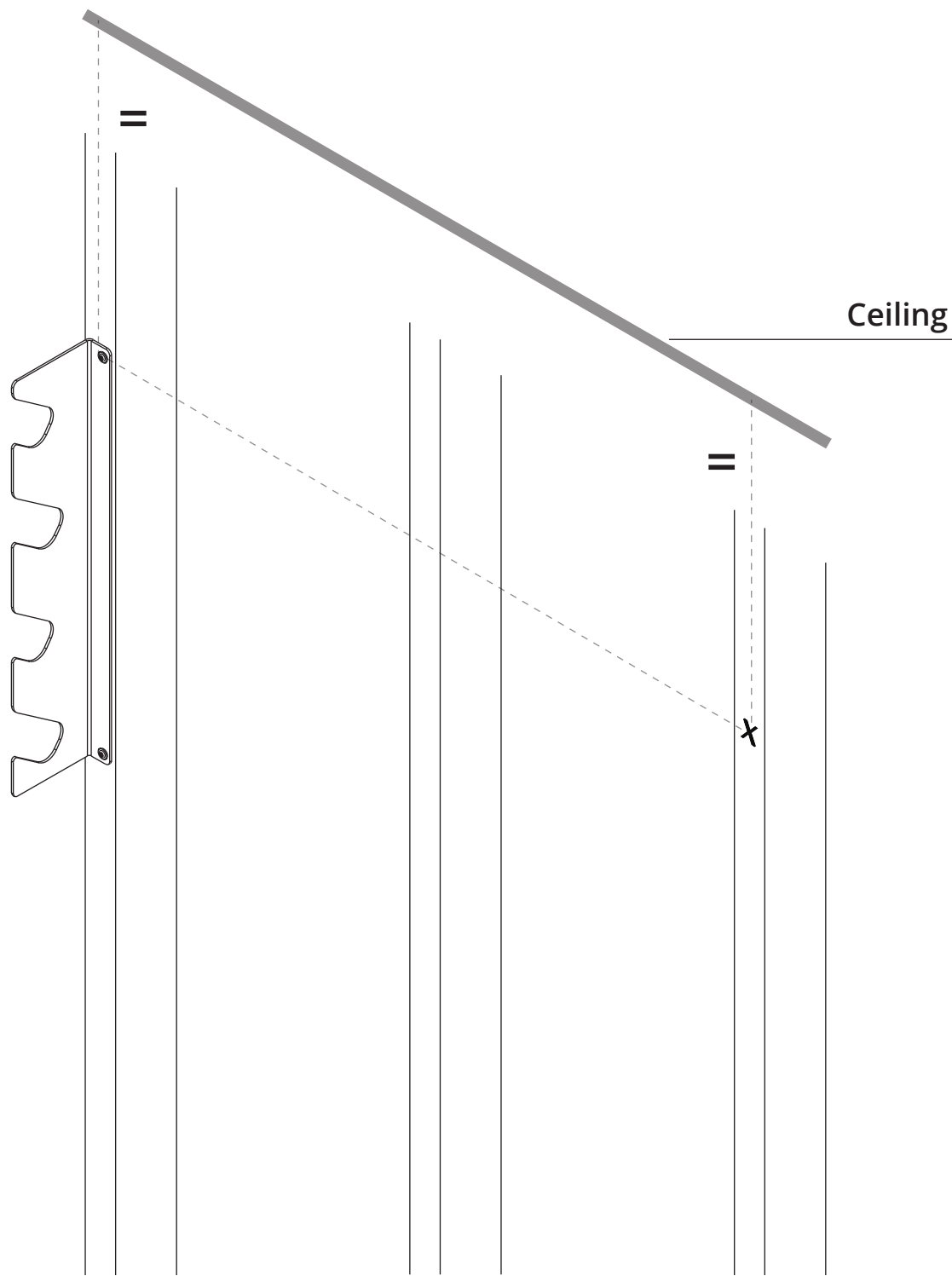

Measure Reference Distance

Utilize a tape measure to determine the distance from the floor (or ceiling) to the top hole of the mounted Horizontal Tool Organizer (A). This measurement serves as a reference for mounting the second organizer.

Install Second Organizer (A)

Repeat Step 2 for the second Horizontal Tool Organizer (A), aligning its top hole with the established reference distance. This ensures a consistent and balanced installation. Complete the process to finish the overall installation of the tool organizers.
